DESCRIPTION OF THE PRESENTATION: As with many other professions, prevention professionals are often faced with challenging ethical dilemmas. To guide behavior, practitioners turn to an ethical code of conduct within their profession. To be credentialed as a Certified Prevention Specialist, practitioners are required to document proof of participation in 6 hours of prevention ethics education, as well as additional ethics training when applying for recertification. In order to deliver a prevention ethics training, participants are requested to take this train-the-trainer workshop. Participants will be provided with all the materials necessary to deliver the training. It is requested that individuals attending this workshop be certified prevention professionals who can draw upon their professional experiences to enhance the training design. This three day workshop is designed to present a 6-hour curriculum that will meet the requirements for the prevention specific ethics required for prevention certification. This training will address knowledge, attitudes and skills needed to train on this topic, as well as practice delivery of the curriculum. This workshop uses highly interactive activities to examine the principles of ethics for prevention professionals. Although there is no charge for participation in this 18-hour training, a commitment or willingness to present on this topic in NH is required. This training is limited to a maximum of 15 participants.

Participants must complete an application form. Participation in this training requires a commitment, or willingness, to train on this topic in the future.
